Overview

Faith is a journey, not a destination. The Servant Leadership Academy is a way to facilitate the journey traditionally called “confirmation.”

Servant Leadership Academy at First Lutheran Church is a family program and helps parents and kids explore, engage and encounter faith as they study side by side with peers and other leaders. ***The goal is not to reach a destination; the goal is the journey itself.***

The opportunities offered in this Academy resemble the university model of “credits,” which we call “steps.” After completing the 40 steps outlined in this program, participants will be encouraged to publicly celebrate this segment of their journey through the Rite of Confirmation.

**After completing the 40 steps of
Servant Leadership Academy,
participants will be able to articulate
their faith through:**

- ***Creating a personal mission statement;***
- ***Defining their values;***
- ***Establishing practices in their daily lives.***

NOTE: Confirmation is not a sacrament in the Lutheran church and is therefore not "required." It is an optional series of worship, lessons, service, and fellowship that help enrich and strengthen our student's faith lives. We hope the flexibility of this program will equip families to uphold expectations and requirements to the best of their abilities.

How does this work? Kids (and parents are encouraged to attend as well) take steps by completing classes that fall under the categories of **cores, electives, and enrichments.**

CORES (required)

- **The Seven Habits of Effective Christian Families** (attended by participants and parents; a prerequisite to enter the SLA program)
- **I Believe In...** (The Apostles' Creed)
- **Ethics and Morality** (Ten Commandments)
- **How to Pray** (The Lord's Prayer)
- **A Means of Grace** (The Sacraments)
- **The Bible for Dummies (or at least confused people)** (Bible literacy, offered in two classes of 3 sessions each)

ELECTIVES

- **Elective courses are mainly interest-based and allow students the opportunity to choose what they would like to learn more about. Elective opportunities will vary from year to year.**

ENRICHMENTS

- **Worship participation**
- **Pew Views** (sermon notes)
- **Capstone** (final faith experience and project)
- **Service opportunities and mission trips**

When are classes offered?

Most courses are offered Wednesdays at 7 p.m. and Sundays at 10 a.m., September through May. Occasionally a class may be offered at a different time or during the summer. The goal is to be flexible in the timing and frequency of classes. Each course will look slightly different but all courses provide a foundation for learning and an opportunity to build relationships with peers and adult leaders.

If a student completes one course per block, he or she should be able to participate in the Rite of Confirmation after three years. While a three-year completion is doable, it is not necessary.

How do I decide what classes to take?

The first step in the journey is family participation in *The Seven Habits of Effective Christian Families* course. We believe deeply in the importance of families walking together on this journey of faith throughout all of Servant Leadership Academy.

This program is designed to be flexible however a *suggested* class schedule for each grade is provided on page 4.

The 2009 National Study on Youth and Religion found "of parents who report that their faith is extremely important in their daily lives, 67% of their teens report that faith is extremely or very important in their daily lives. The opposite is also true: parents for whom faith is somewhat or not at all important have teens who believe the same thing."

9th graders can also fulfill their last credits by participating in our Wednesday Night Youth Activities (WNYA) for Senior High students. They will get one credit for every three times they attend.

Who takes these classes?

This program is designed for the enrichment of the whole church. For kids participating so they may be confirmed, they may start anytime after the completion of 6th grade and complete it on their own schedule. For those students who have already completed some of the traditional confirmation program (9th grade), see below for further information.

How do I register for classes?

Registration for classes is entirely online. You can find the link to Sign Up Genius on the First Lutheran Website homepage by clicking on the *Servant Leadership Academy* link. The entire academic year is online and we highly encourage you to register for the entire year. You must register for a class before the class starts.

What if I have to miss a class?

Students are expected to attend all classes during a session. If you know that you will miss a class, please sign up for another time or class. We understand things come up so if you must miss a class unexpectedly, please inform the teacher. If a student misses more than once, the class must be retaken at another time that is convenient.

What steps have to be completed to participate in the Rite of Confirmation?

Forty steps (credits) need to be completed:

- Core Classes – 12 steps
- Elective Classes – 20 steps
- Enrichments – 8 steps

9th Graders: You have received 12 elective credits for confirmation classes taken before SLA. All the core classes need to be completed, along with 8 enrichment steps, and 8 additional elective steps. Total steps to completion: 28. **OPTION:** 9th graders can also fulfill their last credits by participating in our Wednesday Night Youth Activities (WNYA) for Senior High students. Get one credit for every three times you attend.

Servant Leadership Academy Offerings

CORES CLASSES (required)

Core classes are 2 credits

The Seven Habits of Effective Christian Families You have to go to school for sixteen years to qualify for most jobs in America. But we act like everybody is born knowing how to build and run a family. Learn to establish daily practices that keep God at the center of your family—which keeps your family centered.

7 sessions; Wednesdays, Sept. 27, Oct. 4, 11, 25, Nov. 8, 29, and Dec. 6; 7 p.m. in Celebration Hall. Required for all 7th graders and their parents and new students. Class size is not limited for this course.

Bible Basics 1 & 2 — 2 Parts: We cannot know God if we do not know his Word. This class is offered in two three-part sessions. The first part covers navigation, authorship and relevance. The second part follows the golden thread of grace from Genesis to Revelation. (The class “Seamless for Girls” will also fulfill this requirement.)

2 parts of 3 sessions each; 1st Part: Wednesdays, Sept. 13, 20 and 27; 7 p.m. OR Sundays, Sept. 17, 24 and Oct. 1; 10 a.m. 2nd Part: Wednesdays, Jan. 10, 17 and 24; 7 p.m. OR Sundays, Feb. 25, March 4 and 11; 10 a.m.

Ethics and Morality The Ten Commandments were given to Moses, yet they still speak to our ethical and moral dilemmas of today. How can they guide our values? What do they teach us about our great and glorious God?

3 sessions; Wednesdays, Jan. 3, 10 and 17; 7 p.m. OR Sundays, Jan. 7, 14 and 21; 10 a.m.

How to Pray We cannot have a relationship with someone we hardly talk to, yet prayer is one of the hardest practices we do. Jesus taught us to pray through the Lord’s Prayer. We’ll explore that plus other ways to bring prayer into our daily lives.

3 sessions; Wednesdays, Jan. 24, 31 and Feb. 7; 7 p.m. OR Sundays, Jan. 28, Feb. 4 and 11; 10 a.m.

A Means of Grace Baptism and Communion are an outward sign of the inward grace we have received but cannot earn. Learn about these sacraments of the church and how they can infuse your daily living and faith life.

3 sessions; Wednesdays, April 4, 11, and 18; 7 p.m. OR Sundays, April 8, 15 and 22; 10 a.m.

I Believe In... What are the core beliefs of Christianity? We will take a look at the Apostles’ Creed, each article of the Creed, and their goal of unifying the body of Christ. In other words, we will explore the question “*What do I believe?*”

3 sessions; Wednesdays, April 25, May 2 and 9; 7 p.m. OR Sundays, April 29, May 6 and 13; 10 a.m.

According to the first principle of the Youth and Family Institute: ***“Faith is formed by the power of the Holy Spirit through personal, trusted relationships, often in our own homes.”*** Therefore, we strongly encourage parents to be an active partner with their son or daughter.

Families are expected to worship together Wednesdays at 6 p.m. in Celebration Hall or Sundays at 9 a.m. or 11 a.m. in the Sanctuary or Celebration Hall.

ELECTIVES

Elective classes vary in number of credits and are limited to the first 30 who sign up. A class will not be held if less than 5 people sign up.

Joyful Noise Make a joyful noise to the Lord! This choir is open to 6th-12th graders. They practice every Wednesday and have around four performances during the year. Rehearsal attendance is expected. *One year of regular attendance is worth 2 credits AND all 3 worship participation credits. Each additional year of participation adds 2 credits. Meets Wednesdays 5:30-6 p.m. in the Chapel. Sings in worship at various times and days.*

Stand Up...Sit Down: The Ins and Outs of Worship Through worship, we gather in the promise of Christ to hear the Word and celebrate the sacraments. We will tour worship spaces, learn about the parts of worship and their meaning, and plan a worship service together. *3 sessions; Wednesdays, Sept. 13, 20 and 27; 7 p.m.; 1 credit*

Intro to SLA Start the year out right by attending this teambuilding course which will help us to get to know each other and explore what the year holds. Don't miss it! You'll want to be a part of this vital class that will set you up for success all year. Recommended for new students and 7th Graders. *2 sessions; Wednesdays, Sept. 13 and 20; 7 p.m.; 1 credit*

Selfies, Snaps and Retweets for kids AND parents Christians should be aware of the negative aspects of social networking. Remember that not everyone on the Internet has pure motives, and we can put in safety precautions and be selective as to who is accepted as a "friend" or "fan." Parents—learn how to help your child navigate this maze called social media. *3 sessions; Wednesdays, Oct. 4, 11 and 25; 7 p.m.; 1 credit*

Meditation Mania God has told us to "be still," yet it can be hard to slow down in this hectic world. Learn how to still your mind and body and listen for the still small voice of God. *2 sessions; Wednesdays, Oct. 4 and 11; 7 p.m. OR Sundays, Oct. 8 and 15; 10 a.m.; 1 credit*

Reel Faith Join Catherine, our resident movie nut, as you watch a movie together and discuss how God could be found in the film. Popcorn, pop, and candy provided for a free will offering. The first movie will be "Simon Birch." *1 session for each Sunday. Held on Oct. 15, Jan. 21, Feb. 18 and Mar. 18, 12:30 p.m., Biblemax Theatre; 1 credit per movie*

St. John's Bible Exhibit We have the unique opportunity to view the original pages from the hand-written, hand-illustrated St. John's Bible. Come to the Heritage Hjemkomst for this exhibit and be prepared to be blown away. “Jesus Freaks” Read this book *before* class and then come prepared to discuss impressions and questions about the stories of those who have stood up for Jesus, sometimes at the risk of their lives.

Back to the Future This intergenerational event gives adults the opportunity to share when God became important to them while sharing memories of how things were for them growing up. Adults, bring your high school and college paraphernalia. Students, bring your questions!

7th GRADERS

All 7th grade students will be provided a Teen Bible that they will use for all Servant Leadership Academy classes. It is each student’s responsibility to keep track of their Bible and bring it to class.

If you are not a 7th grader and need a Bible, just let the teacher know and you will be given one you can keep.

Faith and Footholds Learn the physical skills and techniques of good climbing and belaying but our higher purpose is to grow emotionally and spiritually as men and women of faith. Each training session will involve Bible study, discussion and prayer time. Rock climbing offers multiple parallels to life and our faith journey with Jesus.

You Make Me So Mad! Anger is an emotion we all feel, yet it can get us into trouble, hurt our relationships, and ruin our day. Is wrong to get mad? What does the Bible say about our anger?

Who am I Created to be? We are all created in God's image and are called to serve him. This course is designed to help you better understand yourself and to listen for that calling. By the end of this course, you will be able to articulate your values and gifts and have a better understanding of how God has called you.

Worried Sick If we would go around the room and list all the things we are worried about, it would take a week! If you look at the Bible, you'll see worrying isn't just silly, it's the opposite of what God wants us to do. So how do we stop?

Theology Pop What if I have doubts about my faith? How come my parents got a divorce? Why does God allow people to starve to death? Why do bad things happen to good people? Bring your hard questions, and let's have a conversation over a soda pop.

"Seeing the Word" Faith and Art Art teacher Anne Kaese will help us explore the world of art and faith. In class, we will create an embellished letter, play around with gelli pens and calligraphy, learn about the religious symbolism of color in art and then create our own illumination of our favorite text.

Keeping Tech Positive and Healthy Professor Dave Eisenmann talks to students candidly about cyber bullying and harassment, sexting, the dangers of pornography, why they should be cautious about what information they share online and the permanency of their digital record. The presentation is for kids and parents!

Nourishing Your Amazing Body! God has given us our bodies as a gift and they are to be a temple for the Holy Spirit. We have many choices as to the food we eat, the beverages we choose, and what we put in our bodies to get through the day. Through hands-on experience, learn about some better choices to keep our body nourished the way God intended.

“Seamless” Bible study for Girls Cover the people, places, and promises of the Bible, tying them together into the greater story of Scripture. You will gain an overarching understanding of the fundamental layout and meaning of God’s Word.

The Great Escape! Conflict, plot twists, power struggles—these are just some of the things we encounter as we look closer at the story of Moses and his arch-enemy, Pharaoh. From this exciting story of captivity and freedom, we can learn about what it means when Jesus says he sets us free.
