Overview

Faith is a journey, not a destination. The Servant Leadership Academy is a way to facilitate the journey traditionally called “confirmation.”

Servant Leadership Academy at First Lutheran Church is a family program and helps parents and kids explore, engage and encounter faith as they study side by side with peers and other leaders. ***The goal is not to reach a destination; the goal is the journey itself.***

The opportunities offered in this Academy resemble the university model of “credits.” After taking 40 credits through this program, participants will be encouraged to publicly celebrate this segment of their journey through the Rite of Confirmation.

**After completing 40 credits through the
Servant Leadership Academy,
participants will be able to articulate
their faith through:**

- ***Creating a personal mission statement;***
- ***Defining their values;***
- ***Establishing practices in their daily lives.***

NOTE: Confirmation is not a sacrament in the Lutheran church and is therefore not "required." It is an optional series of worship, lessons, service, and fellowship that help enrich and strengthen our student's faith lives. We hope the flexibility of this program will equip families to uphold expectations and requirements to the best of their abilities.

Students (and parents are encouraged to attend as well) take classes that fall under three categories: **cores, electives, and enrichments.** Forty credits are needed to complete the program.

CORES- 12 credits required (2 credits/class)

- **The Seven Habits of Effective Christian Families** (attended by participants and parents; a prerequisite to enter the SLA program)
- **The Creeds** (formerly "I Believe In...")
- **Ten Commandments** (formerly "Ethics and Morality")
- **The Lord's Prayer** (formerly "How to Pray")
- **Sacraments** (formerly "A Means of Grace")
- **Bible Basics** (parts 1 & 2 now combined)

Please note that these names changed this year for clarity. All former names are listed in parenthesis. The course content is the same. Students who took the course under the previous name do not need to retake the course.

ELECTIVES— 20 credits

- **Elective courses are mainly interest-based and allow students the opportunity to choose what they would like to learn more about. Elective opportunities will vary from year to year.**

ENRICHMENTS— 8 credits

- **Worship participation (3 credits)**
- **Service Opportunities (3 credits)**
- **Final Project (2 credits)**

When are classes offered?

Most courses are offered 7-8 p.m. on Wednesdays. Occasionally, a class may be offered at a different time or during the summer. The goal is to be flexible in the timing and frequency of classes.

At this time, Servant Leadership classes are not regularly offered on Sundays. If this does not work for your schedule, please contact Laurie and she would be happy help make an alternative plan.

How do I decide what classes to take?

The first step in the journey is family participation in *The Seven Habits of Effective Christian Families* course. **After this class, we recommend that new students take Core Classes their first year.** Registering for all of the Cores will fill all of the calendar year with the exception of Lent.

This program is designed to be flexible. If you miss a class, there will be opportunities to take it again later. A *suggested* class schedule for each grade is provided on page 4.

According to the first principle of the Youth and Family Institute: ***"Faith is formed by the power of the Holy Spirit through personal, trusted relationships, often in our own homes."*** Therefore, we strongly encourage parents to be an active partner with their son or daughter.

Families are expected to worship together Wednesdays at 6 p.m. in Celebration Hall or Sundays at 9 a.m. or 11 a.m. in the Sanctuary or Celebration Hall.

9th graders can also fulfill their last credits by attending our Senior High program on Sunday nights.

Who takes these classes?

This program is designed for the enrichment of the whole church. Students participating to be confirmed start anytime after the completion of 6th grade and complete it on their own schedule. Most students complete the program in three years.

How do I register for classes?

Registration for classes is all online. You can find the link to Sign Up Genius on the First Lutheran Website by clicking the *Servant Leadership Academy* link. The entire academic year is online and we encourage you to register for the entire year. Please note that elective classes are often limited to 30 participants (Core classes have no limit) so please register early and let us know if you need to cancel a sign-up. You must register for a class before class starts to attend.

What if I have to miss a class?

Students are expected to attend all session of a class, however, we understand things come up. If you must miss a class unexpectedly, please inform the teacher. If a student misses more than once, the class must be retaken at another time that is convenient. If you know that you will miss more than one session of a class, please sign up for another time or another class.

What steps have to be completed to participate in the Rite of Confirmation?

Forty credits need to be completed:

- Core Classes – 12 credits
- Elective Classes – 20 credits
- Enrichments – 8 credits

We will take attendance and track progress. If you need to know where your child is at, please contact Wendi or Meggie and we would be happy to assist you.

OPTION: 9th graders can also fulfil their last credits by participating in our Senior High Program which meets on Sunday evenings at 6 p.m. for one hour. Students will receive one credit for every three sessions they attend. No need to sign-up, just show up!

Servant Leadership Academy Courses

CORES CLASSES (required)

Core classes are worth 2 credits each

Please note that these names have changed for clarity; all former names are listed in parenthesis. The course content is the same. Students who have taken any course under a different name do not need to retake the class.

The Seven Habits of Effective Christian Families You have to go to school for sixteen years to qualify for most jobs in America. But we act like everybody is born knowing how to be a part of a family. Learn to establish daily practices that keep God at the center of your family.

6 Sessions; Wednesdays, September 12, 19, 26, October 3, 10, & 24, 7 p.m.; Celebration Hall; Required for all 7th graders, new students, and their parents

The Sacraments (A Means of Grace) Baptism and Communion are an outward sign of the inward grace we have received but cannot earn. Learn about these sacraments of the church and how they can infuse your daily living and faith life.

2 Sessions; Wednesdays, November 7 & 14, 7 p.m.; Adult Ed Room

The Lord's Prayer (How to Pray) We cannot have a relationship with someone we hardly talk to, yet prayer is one of the hardest practices we do. Jesus taught us to pray through the Lord's Prayer. We'll explore that plus other ways to bring prayer into our daily lives.

3 Sessions; Wednesdays, November 28, December 5, & 12, 7 p.m.; Adult Ed Room

Bible Basics (Parts 1 & 2 now combined): We cannot know God if we do not know his Word. The first couple weeks of class covers navigation, authorship, and relevance of the Bible. The second part follows the golden thread of grace from Genesis to Revelation.

6 Sessions; Wednesdays, Jan. 2, 9, 16, 23, 30, and Feb. 6, 7 p.m.; Adult Ed Room

The Creeds (I Believe In...) What are the core beliefs of Christianity? We will take a look at the Apostles' Creed, each article of the Creed, and its goal of unifying the body of Christ. In other words, we will explore the question *"What do we believe and why?"*

3 Sessions; Wednesdays, Feb. 13, 20, and 27, 7 p.m.; Adult Ed Room

The 10 Commandments (Ethics and Morality) The Ten Commandments were given to Moses 4,000 years ago, yet they still speak to the ethical and moral dilemmas of today. How can they guide our values? What do they teach us about our great and glorious God? Come find out!

2 Sessions; Wednesdays, May 1 and 8, 7 p.m.; Adult Ed Room

7th GRADERS

All 7th grade students will be provided a Teen Bible that they will use for all Servant Leadership Academy classes. It is each student's responsibility to keep track of their Bible and bring it to class.

If you are not a 7th grader and need a Bible, just let the teacher know and you will be given one you can keep.

ELECTIVE CLASSES

Elective classes vary in number of credits and are limited to 30 students. Classes may be cancelled if less than 5 people sign up. Courses are listed by date. Please see the Calendar on page 11 for reference.

Joyful Noise Make a joyful noise to the Lord! This choir is open to 6th-12th graders. They practice every Wednesday and have around four performances during the year. Rehearsal attendance is expected.
Meets Wednesdays 5:30-6 p.m. in the Chapel. Sings in worship at various times and days. First year= 3 worship credits. Each additional year=2 elective credits.

Messy Spirituality Our relationship with God isn't black and white, it's kind of messy. We are messy, unfinished people doing messy, complicated things. Come play messy games and get a glimpse of the abundant, wild, crazy, lavish grace that God showers on us.
5 Sessions; Wednesdays, September 12, 19, 26, Oct. 3, and 10, 7 p.m.; Adult Ed Room; ½ credit per session, 2.5 credits possible

NOOMA: Rain Things don't always work out the way we want. Where is God when it really hurts? Maybe it's when we're in these situations, where everything seems to be falling apart, that God gets an opportunity to remind us of how much he really loves us. Led by Erik Carlson.
Wednesday, September 12, 7 p.m.; BibleMax Theatre; ½ Credit

NOOMA: Sunday Why do we go to church or give money away? Are we supposed to? Does God need it? God hates it when we call ourselves Christians but ignore all the things he REALLY cares about. God doesn't want meaningless rituals. God wants our hearts. Led by Erik Carlson.
Wednesday, September 19, 7 p.m.; BibleMax Theatre; ½ Credit

NOOMA: Name We all spend our lives wondering what others think and say about us. Why are we so concerned with what other people think, say, or look like? Maybe if we knew our true selves, we wouldn't give so much attention to other's lives and be more in tune with the life God wants for us. Led by Erik Carlson.
Wednesday, October 3, 7 p.m.; BibleMax Theatre; ½ Credit

NOOMA: Luggage Maybe a friend turned his or her back on you or someone you loved betrayed you. We all have wounds we carry with us for weeks, months, and sometimes years. Maybe forgiving isn't letting someone else off the hook. Maybe forgiveness is about you. God created you to be free. Led by Erik Carlson.
Wednesday, October 10, 7 p.m.; BibleMax Theatre; ½ Credit

Reel Faith – “I Can Only Imagine” Join our resident movie nut Catherine for a movie and discussion of faith. Popcorn, pop, and candy provided for free will offering. “I Can Only Imagine” focuses on Bart Millard who suffers much abuse at the hands of his father. Follow his story to see how it ends in redemption and forgiveness.
Sunday, October 21, 12:30 p.m.; BibleMax Theater; 1 Credit

Self Defense for Everyone Join Master Carter Evenson, 5th degree Black Belt and our own Rollie Johnson (2nd degree) for a fun evening of learning and laughter. You will learn basic and practical techniques for self-defense and become more self-aware. You might even break a board! Dress is casual.

Wednesday, October 24, 7 p.m.; Gym; ½ Credit

Just Google It How old is Beyoncé? Just Google it! Who are Rhett and Link? Just Google it! Is Jesus God or his own person?... Just Google it? Questions of faith don't always have easy answers. This class will tackle some hard questions and show where to search for answers.

2 Sessions; Wednesdays, November 7 & 14, 7 p.m.; CrossTalk Café; 1 Credit

What is Poverty? Every year, we pack shoeboxes of gifts to send to other countries, but what is life like for those receiving our gifts? This class uses games and activities to help us step into their shoes.

Wednesday, November 14, 7 p.m.; Fellowship Hall; ½ Credit

Reel Faith – “Luther” Join movie nut Catherine for a movie and discussion of faith. Popcorn, pop, and candy provided for free will offering. “Luther” follows Martin Luther as he becomes a monk and begins the dialogue leading to the Protestant Reformation.

Sunday, November 18, 12:30 p.m.; BibleMax Theater; 1 Credit

Other Beliefs If there is only one God, why are there so many religions? Is Christianity the best religion? Why are there so many different Christian churches? If these questions are on your mind, let's look for answers together and explore other beliefs.

3 Sessions; Wednesdays, Nov. 28, Dec. 5, and 12, 7 p.m.; Fellowship Hall; 1 Credit

Money Management In the New Testament, Jesus has more to say about money than almost any other subject. Why is money so important? In this course, teens will learn tips to use their money well and to the glory of God. (For 8th grade and up!)

3 Sessions; Wednesdays, Nov. 28, Dec. 5, & 12, 7 p.m.; CrossTalk Café; 1 Credit

Spending Time We all get the same 24 hours a day, but it seems like there is never enough time to finish everything. Homework, friends, sports, family—they all demand your time and attention. How do we make the best use of our time? The amount of time we have is not the issue. It's how we use our time that counts.

Fear is a Liar You've been told you're not good enough, not right, not strong enough, not worthy, not loved, and not beautiful. Believe me, fear is liar. Don't believe it. Learn to identify the lies our fears create and how to stop them from controlling our lives.

2 Sessions; Wednesdays, Jan 9 and 16, 7 p.m.; Fellowship Hall; ½ Credit

NOOMA: Rich Sometimes we think “our” world is “the” world, but how does what we have compare to what most people have in the world? Maybe what we have is enough; maybe it's more than enough. Maybe God has blessed us with everything we have so we can bless and give to others. Led by Erik Carlson.

Wednesday, January 9, 7 p.m.; BibleMax Theatre; ½ Credit

What is NOOMA?

“Nooma” comes from the Greek word πνεύμα (pneuma) meaning “wind” or spirit and most often relating to the Holy Spirit. *Nooma* is a video curriculum by Rob Bell which tackles hard to answer questions through videos and discussion. Each *Nooma* class will be one *Nooma* video and discussion.

It is easy for us to feel "not good enough" or feel like we don't have what it takes. A closer look at Jesus' life might help us understand the faith God has in all of us. Led by Erik Carlson.

Wednesday, January 16, 7 p.m.; BibleMax Theatre; ½ Credit

Reel Faith – "Expelled" Join movie nut Catherine for a movie and discussion of faith. Popcorn, pop, and candy provided for free will offering. Ben Stein's "Expelled" explores the idea of intelligent design as an alternative to Darwinism. Learn more as he interviews others to battle this issue.

Sunday, January 20, 12:30 p.m.; BibleMax Theater; 1 Credit

Judges Many scholars think Judges might be the oldest book of the Bible. In it, God repeatedly rescues his faithless people, but uses some pretty unlikely people to do it. Deborah was a lady, Gideon was sassy, Ehud was left-handed, and Samson had poor taste in women. Why is that important? Come find out!

Worship: The Ins and Outs Through worship, we gather in the promise of Christ to hear the Word and celebrate the sacraments. We will tour worship spaces, learn about the parts of worship and their meaning, and plan a worship service together.

Broken If God is good, why do bad things happen? If God was really in control, bad things wouldn't happen, right? Together, we'll look at scripture passages about God's control and get a chance to share our own stories on brokenness.

NOOMA: Whirlwind We all go through difficult times. Some are small while others are big and overwhelming. During these times we ask: why do we have to suffer? We don't always get the answers, but sometimes being released from needing answers helps understand what God is doing. Led by Erik Carlson.

Wednesday, February 13, 7 p.m.; BibleMax Theatre; ½ Credit

NOOMA: Bullhorn God loves everyone. Christians should, too. But it's not easy. Sometimes we strongly disagree and it's hard to love others when we feel we are right and they are very wrong. But Jesus doesn't separate loving God and loving others. We are called to love everyone to show our love for God. Led by Erik Carlson.

Reel Faith – "Amazing Grace" Join movie nut Catherine for a movie and discussion of faith. Popcorn, pop, and candy provided for free will offering. "Amazing Grace" shows the British fight to end the shipping of African slaves across the ocean. In the process, all learn the power of God's amazing grace.

Sunday, February 17, 12:30 p.m.; BibleMax Theater; 1 Credit

Can I Ask That? Sometimes, we want to ask questions, but feel like we'll get in trouble if we ask. This is the class to ask those questions and explore the answers. What if I doubt? What does the Bible say about gay people? Can I trust the Bible? Is hell real? Can I do something so bad God won't forgive me? What are your questions?
5 Sessions; Wednesdays, March 13, 20, 27, Apr. 3 and 10, 7 p.m.; CrossTalk Café; ½ Credit per session attended

Uniquely You Who am I and how do I fit in? Sometimes it is hard to remember and believe that we are wonderfully made, beloved children of God with gifts and talents. This class examines how we are all part of the "body of Christ" and how each of us have been given unique gifts.
2 Sessions; Wednesdays, March 13 and 20, 7 p.m.; Adult Ed Room; 1 Credit

Nooma: She A lot of us are comfortable with the male imagery of God, but what about female imagery? Is God limited to a gender? Or is God more? Maybe female imagery for God can help us understand God a little better.
Wednesday, March 13, 7 p.m.; BibleMax Theater; ½ Credit

Reel Faith – "Life is Beautiful" Join movie nut Catherine for a movie and discussion of faith. Popcorn, pop, and candy provided for free will offering. A carefree Jewish librarian and his son become victims of the Holocaust. Using their imagination, Guido works to protect his son by creating a game.
Sunday, March 17, 12:30 p.m.; BibleMax Theater; 1 Credit

Nooma: Rhythm How do we have a relationship with God? God is an infinite spirit. How can we possibly relate to that? And what about Jesus? He said he came to give everyone life in its fullest. He came to show us how to live. Maybe how we live each and every day shows us how "in tune" we are with God.

Faith and Footholds You will learn the physical skills and techniques of good climbing and belaying, but our higher purpose is to grow as men and women of faith. Learn how to use this easy, active, meditative, and playful prayer practice to pray for others, yourself and to show gratitude. Feel yourselves relaxing into God's presence as we pick up our colored pens and pads of paper.

Martin Luther We call ourselves "Lutherans" because of Martin Luther. Learn the history of this guy and why he was important enough to name our denomination after him. Learn about the 95 Thesis, Diet of Worms, indulgences, sola, and other crazy ideas that separated followers of Luther from the Catholic church.
2 Sessions; Wednesdays, April 3 and 10, 7 p.m.; Adult Ed Room; 1 Credit

The 2009 National Study on Youth and Religion found "of parents who report that their faith is extremely important in their daily lives, 67% of their teens report that faith is extremely or very important in their daily lives. The opposite is also true: parents for whom faith is somewhat or not at all important have teens who believe the same thing."

Worship Participation We want you involved, but would rather you chose how. Options include being a greeter, usher, reader or cantor, singing in the choir or worship team, or serving communion. **3 credits required; sign up online; each participation is worth 1/2 credit. Shirley Tietz will contact you to set up time and location after you sign up.**

Service Opportunities A current list of service opportunities is on the right of page 10. More detailed descriptions can be found on our Sign-Up Genius page. Be sure to sign up early, number of volunteers needed may be limited. More opportunities may arise throughout the year; watch for emails. **3 credits required; must sign up online; each service opportunity worth 1/2 credit unless otherwise noted.**

Final Faith Project and Interview (previously called Capstone) This is the last step before the confirmation milestone. Students reflect on their journey thus far: what they've learned and where they're going. The student will create a faith project and then discuss their project with a staff member. This step must be completed to participate in the rite of confirmation. **1 session = 2 final credits!**
