amily trips, as a kid, did not happen a lot, but when they did I have memories of my parents getting lost on several occasions. My dad's preferred course of action was to keep driving hoping to find the way. My mom, on the other hand, would always want to stop at the nearest gas station to ask for directions. It is always better to know the direction than to keep driving with the hope of finding the destination.

Pastor Steph and I believe that the windshield of the car is always bigger than the rearview mirror. We believe that God is calling us forward into what God is doing and what God wants to do. Yes, church life has changed dramatically in the last 50 years. We expected, looking in the rearview, that people would just come to church, and people were simply loyal to institutions and civic organizations. That world seemingly exists only in the rearview mirror. To say the same thing differently, it is time to pull off the road and ask for direction – What is our mission? Where are we going? What is God doing and where is God calling us as a congregation?

The past few years, through prayer and much discernment, we have imagined and have fussed with how God might be leading First Lutheran Church (FLC) forward. We kept coming back to



what Pr. Steph and I want to call, the main thing. The main thing is this living relationship that we have in and through the person of Jesus. That's it, that's the main thing! We want people to know Jesus. Every time Jesus encountered someone life was transformed. He connected with people as they are, where they are, being who they are. He spoke humanity's language. He died and rose, again. He multiplied his efforts with his 12 disciples. He sent them forth to all people, everywhere. The church was his idea to reach out and connect with all people, everywhere.

There are many images of the church in scripture. The Apostle Paul spends a lot of time describing the functionality of church by using this image of the human body. Paul writes, "For as in one body, we have many members and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another (Romans 12:4-5)." This image of body underscores that we are connected

and related to each other. Our lives are graciously not our own. We belong to each other! So, we exist to connect people to God and to each other. It is about connection and relationships – really, that is all there is in life!

Our mission forward is to Connect People to God and to each Other. Our roadmap, over the course of the next three years, will be to Connect, Worship, and leave an Impact as we become a Connecting Church. Will the road ahead be straight? Probably not. Will there be twists and turns? For sure. Will the roadmap be adjusted along the way. Absolutely. Will the Holy Spirit re-route us? Maybe. This is a fluid plan where we constantly discern, ask questions, pray, and seek God's guidance as we serve as a Connecting Church.

The Property Management Committee has been very active this past year! The year began with the completion of the asphalt overlay on the east parking lot, and it turned out great. Pesky water leaks in the Sanctuary are being addressed as they arise. A proposal will be evaluated soon to do some tuckpointing, which should help reduce this problem.

The organ rejuvenation project was started and is scheduled to be completed before Christmas.

This was even more necessary than we thought as we even found a dead bat in one of the pipes!

Much of the committee's time has been devoted to dealing with persistent humidity issues in the Celebration Center. Several "fixes" have not been effective. We have engaged the services of an independent engineer to analyze the situation alongside the services of the Johnson Control team. The question to be answered is, "Did the original

Celebration Center HVAC system design meet/exceed 'expected' professional engineering performance practice?"

We also had a new sign installed on the west side of the building to showcase the new First Lutheran logo.

The committee is very grateful to the First Lutheran Church Foundation for their generous support as we deal with ongoing expenses to keep our facility in good repair!

The First Lutheran Church (FLC) Global Mission Committee is dedicated to helping build God's kingdom, serving as a connector between our church and God's mission around the world. The FLC Global Mission Committee supported mission work with disbursements of **\$90,140** in the fiscal year 2023-2024. Our committee was privileged to serve and hear stories of faith and impact from people who are committed to "make disciples of all nations".

updates about their work in Ecuador.

- Mission Experience in Ecuador eight women from FLC traveled to Ecuador for a mission experience in April 2024. They helped facilitate a women's retreat for mission workers and connected with additional mission partners Carmen Bajo and Casa Gabriel.
- \$9,500 given to Amistad Worldwide to Build 50 Wells – Amistad Worldwide is a nonprofit that brings the Gospel and sustainable solutions to poverty in India, Nepal, and Uganda.

It's been a wonderful year for First Lutheran Quilters. We continue to meet on Monday mornings with 15-20 ladies in our group. Many wonderful donations of money, fabric, and sheets have been received and allowed us to ship **302** quilts in the last calendar year to Lutheran World Relief (LWR). Quilts were also given to the Home Sweet Home

project here at First Lutheran and five quilts were given to an adult family with children for a baptism. A small group of individuals continue to pack LWR baby layettes. We've had several ladies at a senior apartment in Fargo turn donated t-shirts into diapers! Donna Alby leads this group, and their efforts are greatly appreciated. Betty Holmen supplies endless beautiful quilts for the kits. First Methodist Church in Fargo donates much

of our baby clothing. We have received several donations of soap and hand towels. This year we were able to ship 102 baby kits to LWR. We had a longtime member step away from quilting this year. Many years of sewing by Wini Christensen have been very appreciated. Our group continues to supply much needed items to war torn countries and places of deep poverty. We feel privileged to be a part of LWR efforts to help others in need!

### **ASQ**

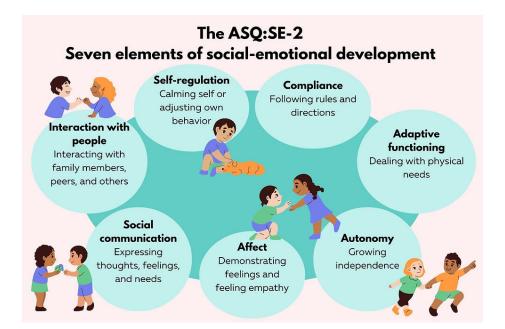

### **WATER AND BIKE DAYS**

During the summer months we had monthly activities planned. We offered weekly **water days**, which consisted of water tables and a splash pad. We also had a **bike day**, where kids could bring in their bicycle or scooter (along with a helmet). FLC graciously

blocked off the west parking lot for us and each class was able to ride their bikes/scooters in the parking lot. This event received such positive feedback from both parents and kids!

### **HANDS ON LEARNING**

In April, we had a very fun and educational experience. Woodbury Hatchery out of Wyndmere, ND graciously donated **chicken eggs** to Sandy

Otteson to incubate and hatch with the children. We set up an incubator in the office and watched and cared for them for 21 days, after which we observed the baby chicks hatch out of their eggs. After they hatched, we set up a brooder with food and water. Each classroom named a chick, and all the children were able to visit and see how fun they are. We kept them with us for a little over a week, and then they went to the farm of a paraprofessional teacher.

In June, we purchased **painted lady caterpillars!** We watched them grow and turn into a chrysalis. We then had them in netting for 10 days. Once they turned into butterflies, we set them free.

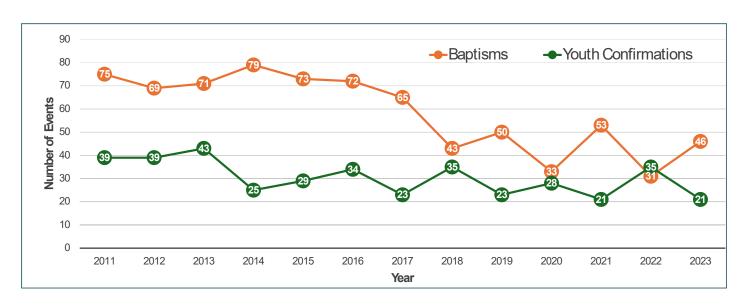

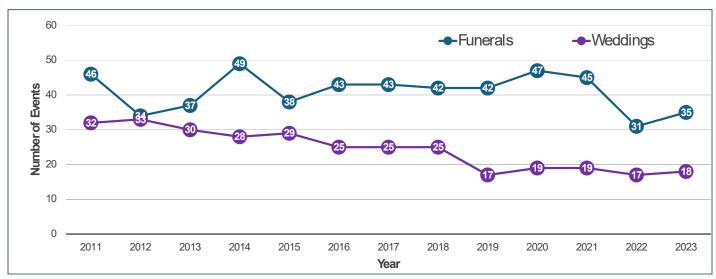


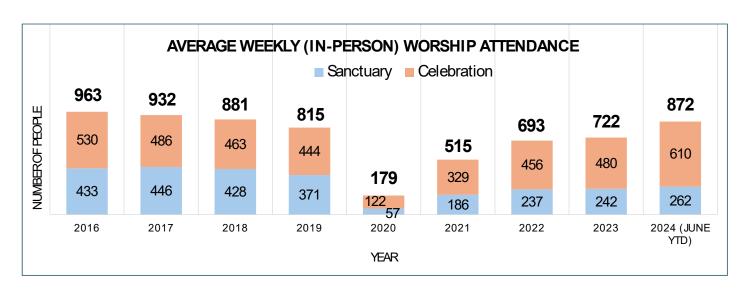
